

THE WORLD WIDE CHECK-IN

The following are rules for inclusion within the official final log.

- 1) Station MUST be a valid Call Sign issued by an authorised authority within the ITU.
- 2) Station MUST have a valid 7 Digit **DMR ID** issued by **RADIOID.NET** (Or any predecessor) That is publically searchable for validation if required.
- 3) The **NCO In-Charge** at the time of the net has the final say on any amendments. These must be relayed to the **LOG PROCESSOR** As soon as practicable after the net has ended.
 - (i) The recommended method is via e-mail to net.logging@worldwidecheckin.net
 - (ii) Or; Other mutually agreed methods maybe used.
- 4) Both Call Sign and DMR ID should be registered with the **BRANDMEISTER NETWORK**. This is vitally important in case of disputes of inclusion. The “*Last Heard*” will be used to confirm the station.
- 5) The **LOG PROCESSOR** will only accept amendments at the request of the **NCO In-Charge**.
 - (i) For the avoidance of any doubt the term “**NCO In-Charge**” is the Network Control Operator who is authorised to run the net as per the NCO Scheduling. No other station has authority to overrule the **NCO In-Charge**.
- 6) No further amendments can be made to the official log once 24 Hours has elapsed from the end of the Net. No correspondence will be entered into after this period.
 - (i) The time zone used by the World-Wide Check-In is UTC / GMT / Zulu Time -/+0.
- 7) The formal and official log will be published on <https://www.worldwidecheckin.net/> site at midnight UTC (00:00). On occasions this may be delayed due to various issues, such as objections, amendments, disputes also to permit for any holiday period or system issues. This list is not exhaustive.
